

- (D) Lamp Base (1)
- (E) Bolts (2)
- (F) Allen Wrench (1)
- (G) Adapter (1)
- (H) Dimmer Switch (1)

IMPORTANT SAFETY FEATURES

The LED tape is replaceable.

WARNINGS

All wires are connected. When unpacking, be careful not to pull wires, as damage may result. Do not connect electricity until the lamp is fully assembled. To reduce the risk of fire, electrical shock, or personal injury, always turn off the lamp and allow it to cool prior to replacing the LED tape. Do not touch or look directly at the LED tape when the lamp is illuminated. Keep flammable materials away from lit LED tape.

ASSEMBLY AND INSTALLATION

- Carefully remove all parts from the box and remove all plastic coverings.
- Join Leg (C) to Lamp Base (D) by aligning the holes and secure with Bolts (E) using Allen Wrench (F).
- 3. Loosen Lock Knobs (B), adjust Upper Rod (A) to the desired height, then tighten Lock Knobs (B).
- 4. Connect Adapter (G) to the power cord.
- 5. Plug into an electrical outlet and test the lamp.
- 6. Assembly is complete.

TO OPERATE THE SWITCH:

- When the lamp is unlit, simply tap Dimmer Switch (H) to turn the lamp on.
- To adjust the brightness, tap and hold your finger on Dimmer Switch (H) and the light will begin to dim up or down. To dim the opposite way, remove your finger, then tap and hold again until the desired light level is achieved.
- 3. To turn the lamp off, tap Dimmer Switch (H).

CARE INSTRUCTIONS

Do not use polishes or cleaners on the lamp.


Wipe clean with a soft, dry cloth.





LED MODULE REPLACEMENT INSTRUCTIONS

PLEASE NOTE THAT THE LED REPLACEMENT MUST ONLY BE PERFORMED BY A LICENSED ELECTRICIAN.

- Place the complete shade with the LED module on a solid and clean surface.
- 2. Unscrew the end cover by turning in a counterclockwise direction, and then take it out from the shade (Fig. 1).
- 3. Pull the PC diffuser out by hand carefully (Fig. 2).
- 4. Pull out the fixture Neutral/Hot wires from the LED module. Then, remove the LED module from the shade by unscrewing both washers and bolts (Fig. 3).
- Place some thermal conductive silicone onto the backside of the new LED module, attach the new LED module to the shade, and secure with both washers and bolts.
- 6. Insert the lamp wires into the corresponding hole on the LED module.
- 7. Replace the end cover to the shade. Test the lamp.
